

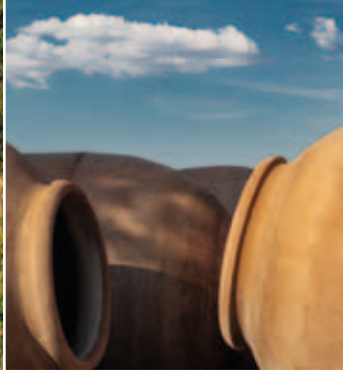

▸ ALENTEJO ◀

The Alentejo is one of Portugal's most important wine regions. With over ten percent of the country's vineyards it continues to stand out as one of the favourite regions for both Portuguese and foreign consumers. The region is home to local Portuguese varietals and those from abroad, including Aragonez, Alfrocheiro, Alicante Bouschet, Castelão, Trincadeira, Touriga Nacional, Touriga Franca, Moreto, Syrah and Cabernet Sauvignon, among the reds, and Antão Vaz, Arinto, Roupeiro, Fernão Pires, Manteúdo, Perrum, Rabo de Ovelha, Tamarez, Trincadeira das Pratas, Viosinho, Verdelho e Chardonnay, among

the whites. The red wines are full-bodied and rich in tannins with strong hints of forest fruits on the nose, and the whites are generally smooth, with aromas of tropical fruit.

With such good wines to offer, it is not surprising that the Alentejo should have all the necessary ingredients for the development of wine-based tourism. It is indeed one of the best regions in Portugal in this regard, and offers a wide array of wineries, restaurants and hotels. The food is excellent and there is no shortage of good wine, the hardest part is choosing what to pick!

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ADEGA CARTUXA ÉVORA

Only a few kilometres from the centre of the historic city of Évora, the Cartuxa winery in Quinta de Valbom operates in what used to be a Jesuit retirement home, which already had a wine press in 1776. The estate belongs to the Eugénio de Almeida Foundation, created in 1963 by Vasco Maria Eugénio de Almeida, a Portuguese businessman, philanthropist and patron of the arts. Currently it is used as an ageing centre for Cartuxa wines and the headquarters of their enotourism project. The actual production takes place in two more recent wineries just a few kilometres away, at Herdade de Pinheiros.

Vidigueira is located in the heart of the Alentejo, between Beja and Évora. Here, where the hills, the plain and the river meet, we can find the Vidigueira Cooperative Winery, founded in 1960 with the aim of supporting wine producers in their mission to make better quality wines. It is considered one of the oldest in the country, and currently boasts 294 members. The winery is equipped with state of the art technology, thanks to improvements which have been implemented over the past years. In terms of enotourism, the wine tastings are inspired by the Portuguese discoveries.

Founded on April 24th, 1955, the Adega de Borba pioneered the relaunching of wine production in the Alentejo. In the 80's it achieved the national prestige it still enjoys and which has been of great benefit to the member producers. With a new winery built in 2014, equipped with state of the art technology, it produces a wide range of wines and brandies, as well as vinegar and olive oil. Here, Borba really stands out as that which unites, and is common to, the many different producers involved.

Diseases such as oidium, mildew and phylloxera destroyed the wines and dreams of many producers in the 19th century. But in the following century new hope was introduced by the creation of cooperatives which brought the wine culture back from the brink. It was at this time that the Redondo Cooperative Winery was created, with only 14 members at the time. Business has since successfully expanded and it currently boasts 200 members, making it one of the region's references in terms of cooperatives. The cooperative mostly produces reds, although there are also whites and, more recently, rosés.

This winery was purchased in 1980 by the Calisto family, which owns the Sociedade Agrícola Quinta da Várzea. It is located to the North of the city of Reguengos de Monsaraz, spread over thirty two hectares which include varieties such as Trincadeira, Aragonês, Alicante Bouschet, Touriga Nacional, Castelão, Touriga Franca, Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah (reds), and Alvarinho, Antão Vaz, Síria, Rabo D'Ovelha and Sauvignon Blanc (whites). The winery itself, built from scratch in 2004, has a fine view of the vineyards and is equipped with modern technology.

Located near the city of Estremoz, this winery is a dream come true. It belongs to Luís Louro, who was born into a family with traditions in the wine business. Having completed his studies in Agro-industrial Engineering, and an internship in California, he began to work with his father, Miguel Louro, at Quinta do Mouro. In 2004, however, he decided to go ahead with his own project and he is now a dynamic and renowned wine producer. The tasting room, above the cask cellar and made entirely out of glass, is located on the lawn, with a beautiful view of the Estremoz Castle.

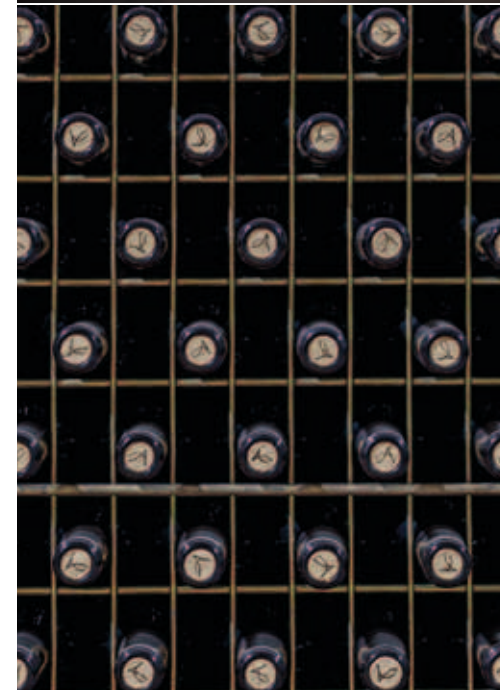

This winery is situated near Juromenha, in Alandroal, just fifteen kilometres outside of Elvas. Founded in 1995, the estate belonged to hotel and restaurant entrepreneur Manuel Calado. Wine production began in 2001 and, since then, sons João Paulo and José have also become involved in the project. The winery is located in the middle of the vineyard, in mostly schist soils, built in a contemporary and minimalist style, which fits into the Alentejo landscape perfectly.

Since 1986, this winery has belonged to José Maria da Fonseca, a company from the Setúbal Peninsula, which branched into the production of Alentejo wine. José de Sousa was founded in 1878 and boasts an underground winery with state of the art technology, but it still keeps the large clay amphorae used to make wine according to a traditional method started by the Romans over two thousand years ago. Some already belonged to the estate under its former owner, but most were purchased since then. They are all exhibited in the old winery, which has been converted into an archaeological museum and where you can also find two traditional foot treading presses.

Commodore Rui Nabeiro had the dream of placing Campo Maior on the world map of enotourism. He began by planting the first vines in Herdade da Godinha in 1997 and, three years later, in Herdade das Argamassas, upon which he also built the winery. Adegas Mayor opened in 2007 and immediately set itself apart as a landmark, due to the signature architecture of renowned Siza Vieira. Rita Nabeiro, the grand-daughter of the commodore, is currently ahead of the project, with her mind constantly set to innovation, but with respect for tradition.

Situated near Estremoz, the Adegas Vila Santa belongs to João Portugal Ramos, one of Portugal's leading wine producers. Born into a family steeped in wine traditions, the oenologist began his career in 1980, in the Alentejo, as a consultant for various producers. A decade later, already ahead of his own project, he began to plant his first hectares of vines, and later built a winery. The success of his business allowed him to acquire more vines and increase the winery. Today he produces wines in different regions of Portugal, but the Alentejo is still his crown jewel.

CARMIM is the acronym for the Agricultural Cooperative of Reguengos de Monsaraz, which was founded at the beginning of the seventies. It also alludes to the the colour of red wine and the council's flag. It has a total of 970 members who, together, operate 3700 hectares of vineyard. Business has allowed the cooperative to invest in a new winery in 1991, equipped with the most advanced technology, as well as a new bottling hall. Carmim produces red and white wines, young and reserve, as well as rosés, sparkling and liqueurs, but also renowned brandies and olive oils.

The heritage of the Sabicos House comes from Dona Sabica, an important figure in the second half of the 19th century and matriarch of a farming family which left its mark in the villages of Montoito, in Redondo. This widow, and mother of eight, encouraged each of her descendants to produce their own grapes and wine, and this would go on to become one of the main family businesses. Several decades later, the Sociedade Agrícola Santana Ramalho was founded by Joaquim Madeira and Graça Santana Ramalho, great-grandchildren of Dona Sabica, with the express aim of recovering the family's vinicultural traditions.

In 1999, Jorge Rebelo de Almeida and José Lavrador, who were in business together in the Vila Galé hotel group, purchased several plots of land in Beja, creating the Herdade da Malhada, upon which they built a hotel and a winery. Thus was born Santa Vitória, a company founded in 2002 for the production and sale of high quality Alentejo wines and olive oils. The vineyards around the winery include white and red varietals, both of Portuguese and foreign origin.

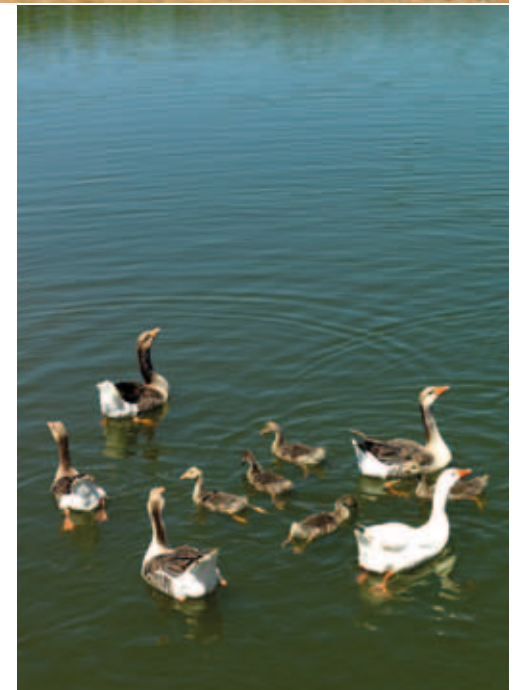

The estate belongs to Hans Kristian Jorgensen and Carrie Jorgensen, a Danish and American couple who visited Portugal towards the end of the nineties on a sailing ship, fell in love with Vidigueira and decided to plant a vineyard. They initially opted for red varieties on this hillside of the Serra do Mendro, four hundred meters above sea level, but later planted whites as well, brought over from another vineyard planted on the coast of the Alentejo, just three kilometres from the sea, near Vila Nova de Milfontes. Now they have a more varied range of products, including rosés.

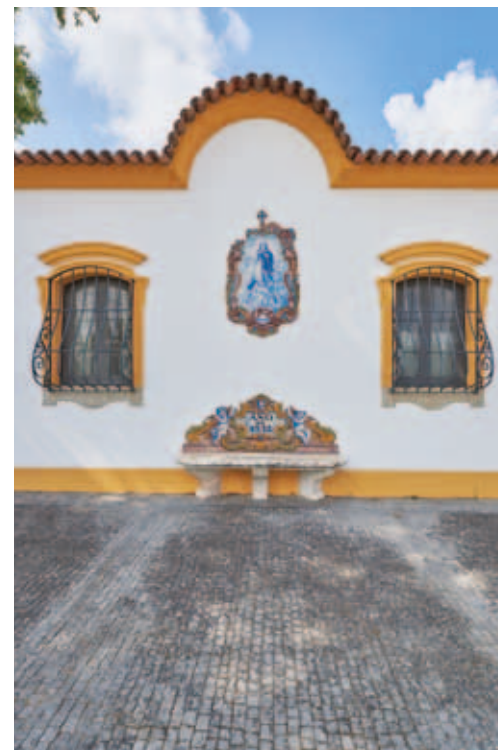

American Dorinda and Dutchman Mark Winkleman first came to Portugal as a couple on holiday. As they travelled around the country they visited the Alentejo and fell in love with the Nossa Senhora da Conceição estate, north of Évora, which they finally bought in 1999. Their philosophy was based on an investment in biodynamics, as well as use of natural and water resources, and their first harvest was in 2010. Initially, they only wanted to produce wine to drink at home and with their friends, but business soon got serious and they have gone commercial.

Located near the Alentejo city of Estremoz, this estate belongs to producer José Castro. The enotourism project operates out of Quinta da Esperança, where you will also find the winery. The first vines were planted in 1993 and, in 2001, the first wines were launched. José Castro was a pioneer in the introduction of producing techniques such as nocturnal mechanical harvests, aimed at preserving the aromas and the quality of the grapes by avoiding the high temperatures of the Alentejo. There is an extensive range of grapes on these fifty hectares of vineyard, including national and international varieties.

The first record of wine production on this property dates back to 1880, by Maria Luísa Godinho, grandmother of the Count of Ervideira. José Perdigão Rosado de Carvalho was given the title of Count of Ervideira by King Carlos I, in recognition of his social work in the region. He was a proficient farmer who generated hundreds of jobs and helped the poor, as well as taking on several political offices. Wine production was initially aimed at subsidising workers' wages and contributing to the family budget, but evolved so successfully that his great-grand-children continue to run the business.

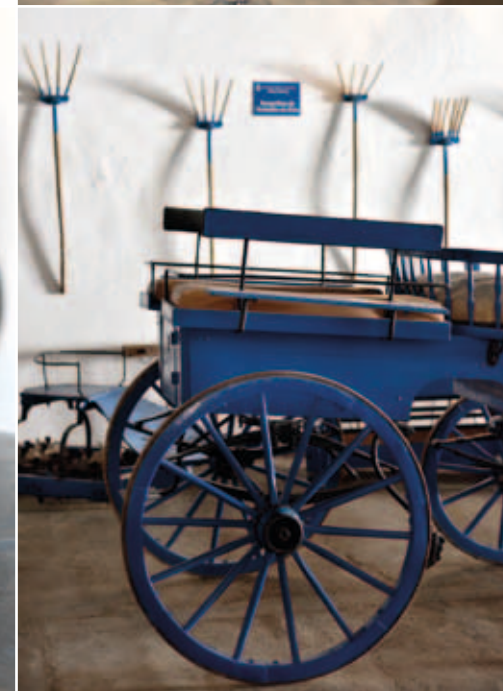

This foundation is considered one of the most important in terms of social support in the district of Portalegre, and was founded in 1948 by Cosme de Campos Callado, only heir of Francisco Abreu Callado, who in turn had founded the farming company which bears his name and which is one of the wealthiest in the Alentejo. The headquarters of the foundation, situated in a typical Alentejo style house, is in Benavila, near the Maranhão reservoir, which also houses the winery, where traditional and modern wine-making and ageing techniques can still be found, side by side.

This property is located just outside of Vendas Novas, in the district of Évora, and 145 of its 360 hectares are made up of vines, mostly red varieties. Dry farming, pastures and cork groves also exist on the farm. Wine was first bottled here in 2000, when the Herdade da Ajuda still belonged to its former owners, so when it was bought by producer Pedro Barreto, in 2007, it already had all the conditions required to continue to produce wine. Enotourism has since become an essential component of business.

The Herdade da Calada was founded in 1854 by descendants of the Duke of Lancaster and over the years it has been subject to renovations and improvements. The current owners, Maria and André Jean-Claude Penauille, who bought it in 2007, opened it up to enotourism. The property operates thirty five hectares of vineyard which is mostly composed of traditional Alentejo varietals, produced at low rates so as to obtain high quality wines. The winery uses state of the art technology and grapes are gravity fed, so as to preserve all their characteristics and quality.

The first vines were planted in 2001 and, two years later, the winery was built. This is an eco-friendly project, which follows a philosophy of integrated production, making the most of available resources while protecting the environment.

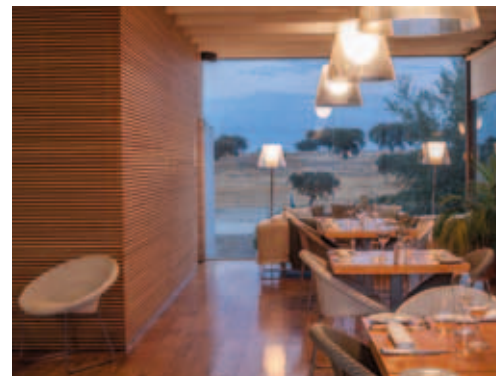

Until the year 2000 the grapes were sold, but after that he began to bottle his own brand of wine. The winery, equipped with modern technology, fits perfectly into the Alentejo landscape. Currently, Henrique Uva shares this project with his daughters Maria and Sofia Uva, both of which are responsible for the nnotourism department.

Grapes are hand-picked before being sent to the winery, which was built in 2005. The family began to invest in enotourism in 2008.

Built from scratch, the right-angled, shale covered building was designed by Filipe Nogueira Alves, Margarida Direitinho and Nuno Ramos, the same team of architects who designed the winery in 2004.

It currently boasts twenty-two hectares of vines, which include Trincadeira, Aragonez, Touriga Nacional, Tinta Caiada, Cabernet Sauvignon, Petit Verdot and Alicante Bouschet (reds), as well as Arinto and Antão Vaz (whites). The property uses conventional and biological techniques. No herbicides are used and natural crops are planted in the winter so as to protect the soils. The low production of the vineyard leads to high concentrations of scents and flavour.

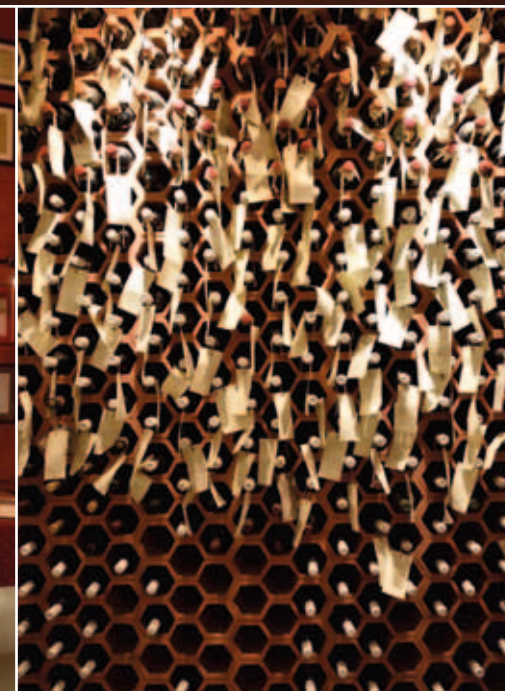

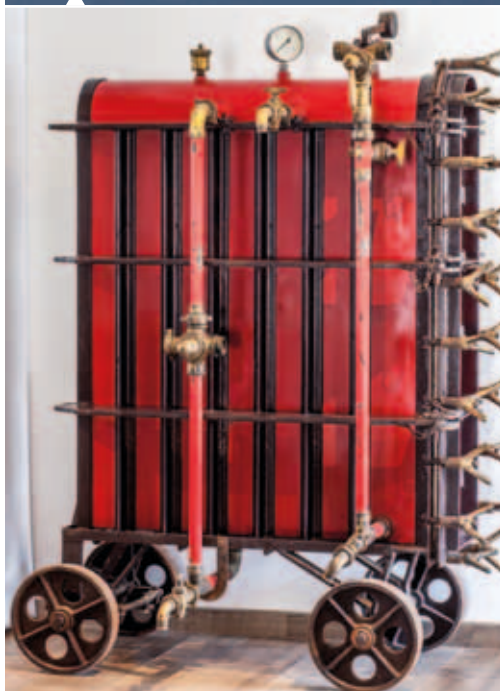
